How many litters are present?

Accompanying a nest well takes time!

Is the mother dog present?

Do not buy a puppy if the mother is not present, but come back another time.

Is the nest in the house?

This is important to grow up to be a stable dog!

Is it clean?

Hygiene is important!

How do the puppies respond to visitors?

A well socialized puppy is curious and not afraid.

How do the puppies respond to sounds?

A well-socialized puppy is not frightened by domestic noises.

Do the puppies have a vaccination certificate?

Vaccination and worming is important for the health of the puppy.

Have the parents been tested for hereditary defects, and are there official documents?

Know which abnormalities may play a role in the breed and ask for test results to minimize the chance of abnormalities in your puppy.

Does the breeder provide clear information and also ask questions?

A good breeder wants his puppies to end up well and does not just give them away. Providing written information is mandatory for anyone who regularly breeds litters.

Can you take a look and ask questions during your visit?

A responsible breeder takes the time for you.

Can you come and see several times or do you have to decide right away?

With responsibly bred puppies there are no 'special offers' or 'up = up' promotions!

Is there a clear purchase contract?

Make sure that the agreements are clear.

When in doubt: don't!

It is no use to you if you have regretted your purchase for an entire dog's life!
